- With a quota on participating schools, the ICH Office will <u>only</u> notify the successful applicants via email for confirmation of participation and further programme arrangements. Schools on the waiting list will NOT receive our confirmation emails.
- 2) Applications and enrollment results are subject to the ICH Office's final decision and approval.
- 3) While the provision of personal data is voluntary, the staff of the ICH Office may not be able to process the application due to insufficient information provided. Personal data given by the applicant in this form shall be used for processing the application in accordance with Sections 18, 22 and Principle 6 of Schedule 1 to the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance (Cap. 486 HK Laws). Request for access and/or correction of personal data stated in this form should be made to the ICH Office staff at 2356 0500.
- 4) Arrangements before the commencement of the programmes

The ICH Office will contact the participating schools for the following arrangements:

- Confirm the programme date and discuss the programme rundown (e.g. time and venue)
- Provision of the campus floorplan by the participating school
- Provision of a photo(s) of the ICH vehicle's parking space by the participating school
- ICH Office staff will conduct site visits at the participating school to inspect the campus environment and facilities in preparation for the activities
- Other items pertaining to the programmes
- Programme arrangements are subject to the ICH Office's final decision
- 5) Arrangements under inclement weather

## Applicable to primary and secondary schools:

- If Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 or above / Red or Black Rainstorm Warning Signal is issued 3 hours before the commencement of the programmes, regardless of the lowering time, all the programmes on the day will be cancelled.

- If Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 or above / Red or Black Rainstorm Warning Signal is issued when the programmes have already started, all the programmes in progress will be suspended.

- If the Education Bureau announces class suspension, programmes will be cancelled.

## Applicable to primary schools only:

- If Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 3 / Red Rainstorm Warning Signal is issued 3 hours before the commencement of the programmes, all the programmes on the day will be cancelled.

## 6) Notes on the access of the ICH vehicle to campus

- To ensure sufficient space for students boarding/alighting from the vehicle and to allow evacuation in case of emergency, the participating school must reserve a minimum of 2.5 m distance from each side of

the ICH vehicle's parking space. Please also ensure that the road for the access to campus allows the entry of a 9-tonne truck measuring 5.3 m (length) x 2.2 m (width) x 3.1 m (height). The participating school is NOT required to provide electricity for the ICH vehicle, which has already been equipped with batteries. - Specifications of the ICH vehicle are as follows:

Emission standard: Euro VI

Electric motor standard: provision of electricity by batteries

- To ensure the safety of students, the ICH vehicle will only enter the campus when all students are inside the school buildings.

- The anti-bacteria surface treatment has been applied to the ICH vehicle, disinfecting the surfaces to eradicate SARS-CoV-2 and over 99.9% of virus and bacteria. Prior to entry to campus, the equipment and installations in the ICH vehicle are cleaned thoroughly with 1 in 99 diluted household bleach.

## 7) <u>Notes on other matters</u>

- The participating school should arrange teaching staff to escort students to the activity venues, to count the number of students before and after the activities, and to maintain discipline during the activities.

- The participating school should allow the ICH Office and programme-related staff to enter the campus for programme coordination, execution and inspection, as well as collection of feedback from the participants.

- During the programmes, the ICH Office and programme-related staff may arrange to create photos, audios, videos and other forms of records (collectively, "programme records"), for future uses with noncommercial purposes such as education, outreach and publicity. By participating in the programmes, the school agrees to grant full rights to the ICH Office to use the programme records without restriction or payment. If the school has any objection to the use of programme records, please discuss with the ICH Office staff prior to the school's confirmation of participation in the programmes.
